FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



As another successful academic session, 2025–26, draws to a close, I feel privileged to reflect upon the many accomplishments and memorable moments that have enriched the experience at IMCG (PG) F-7/2. By the infinite blessings of ALLAH ALMIGHTY, our institution has continued to progress with purpose and distinction, remaining steadfast in its commitment to excellence and holistic education.

The past year has been marked by noteworthy achievements in academics, where our students demonstrated diligence, perseverance, and a genuine passion for learning, especially at BS level. The dedication of our BS students and the untiring efforts of our faculty, received recognition at the 45th Convocation and Prize Distribution Ceremony. The event celebrated the dedication and hard work of students from the academic sessions: 2018–2022, 2019–2023, 2020–2024, and 2021–2025. A total of 585 students have graduated to date. Among them, 198 students earned positions on the Roll of Honours, fulfilling the criterion for winning a place on the Roll of Honour by achieving 3.8 or above CGPA. 39 of our students of BS programs achieved a CGPA of 4.0 across

multiple academic sessions, becoming the pride of our institution. Additionally, 47 position holders were recognized for their exceptional achievements across the respective subjects and sessions. The overall result is 98.25% and CGPA is 3.625, reflecting outstanding scholastic performance.

I believe that education extends far beyond the classroom, and throughout the session our students actively engaged in a wide array of co-curricular activities designed to cultivate creativity and confidence. Competitions in debating, public speaking, literary pursuits, fine arts, Qira'at, Na'at, and other intellectual and cultural forums provided valuable opportunities for self-expression and personal growth. The enthusiasm and talent displayed by our students were truly inspiring. Women Entrepreneurship Expo was held twice in the academic year to encourage the students towards financial independence.

The sporting arena also witnessed remarkable participation and achievement. Through various athletic and team events, our students exemplified determination, discipline, and sportsmanship. Their successes brought recognition to the institution and reaffirmed the importance of physical fitness and healthy competition as essential components of a balanced education.

The achievements of this session would not have been possible without the collective efforts of our dedicated faculty and staff. I am equally proud of our students. They represent the promise of a brighter future and the true measure of our success as an educational institution.

I extend my best wishes to all students, teachers, and staff for continued success and fulfilment in the years to come.



A YEAR OF ACHIEVEMENT: Inside and Beyond the Classroom

Excellence Award Ceremony

An Excellence Award Ceremony 2024-25 was hosted by Islamabad Model College for Girls (Postgraduate) F-7/2 Islamabad on 18th December, 2025. The dignified ceremony aimed to recognize and reward meritorious students for their hard work and exceptional results in the BS degree examinations as well as the HSSC Part I & II Annual Examinations conducted by the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (FBISE). The event brought together students, faculty and distinguished guests to celebrate the scholastic achievement of our students. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Syed Junaid Ikhlq, Director General (Federal Directorate of Education). Certificates of Merit and cash prizes were distributed among the top position holders of HSSC Part I & II as well as BS degree program by the august chief guest.



- Due to the revolutionary steps taken by the college administration and the faculty, the college gained a note-worthy success in the annual result of **FBISE HSSC-II (2025)** and achieved a **GPA of 4.18** with a massive number of 1063 students, who appeared in the examination. The college secured an astounding pass percentage of **94.45%**.
- In the Academic year 2024-25, **15** students from **BS Chemistry**, **16** students from **BS Psychology**, **04** students from **BS Economics** and **02** students from **Islamic Studies** have secured a CGPA of **4.0**. It is, indeed, a matter of great pride for the Institution that **37** students have secured **4.0** CGPA in our BS Programmes.
- In **International Stemco Science Contest 2025**, **3 Bronze Medals** have been won by our brilliant students: Aiza Nawaz, Saba Batool and Alia Mazhar.



Huda Khalid, a brilliant student of BS Chemistry, has been awarded the **Dr. Azra Raza Award** along with a cash prize of Rs. 50,000 for securing overall 1st position and perfect CGPA in BS Chemistry.



Our students participated in the **International English Subject Contest (IESC)** conducted by Creative Learning Services in collaboration with SiL Testing System, UK, in 2025. A total of 55 students participated, and their results reflect their hard work and dedication. **Two of our remarkable**

students, Ayesha Rizwan and Areeba Nadeem, achieved the honour of winning Silver Medals while 15 students earned 3-Star Certificates, 20 students secured 2-Star Certificates, and 9 students received 1-Star Certificates for their commendable performance.

- **Two** brilliant students of Islamabad Model College for Girls (Postgraduate) F-7/2, Faryal Qadeer and Shah Noor, got **second position** in the **Battle of the Brains III-----** a National level Mathematics Quiz Competition organized by NUML in 2025.
- Adding another feather to our cap, **Amna Khurram**, from 2nd year O, secured **2nd position** at the senior level (1st year to 4th year) of the **Poster Competition** held at **Pakistan National Council of the Arts**. Her painting aroused patriotic sentiments among the onlookers on our resounding win in Marka-e-Haq; making her eligible for the honour of receiving a cash prize of **Rs. 12,000** as well.



- The **Media Coordination and Outreach Wing of Election Commission of Pakistan** organised a dignified **prize distribution ceremony** at the ECP Secretariat on 12th December, 2025 for the winners of an activity titled "A Letter to my First Vote", held on 16th October, 2025, at IMCG (Postgraduate) F-7/2 Islamabad.

The activity was organised by Election Commission of Pakistan, in collaboration with Pakistan Post, in which nearly 100 of our students participated enthusiastically. The activity was conducted at the college on the directive of Federal Directorate of Education for engaging the youth in the electoral process. The students wrote elaborate and emotionally charged letters to their first vote in Urdu or English.

10th February 2026 marked the successful hosting of Intercollegiate Urdu Debate Competition and Intercollegiate Computer Graphics Competition at Islamabad Model College for Women (PG) F-7/2 Islamabad. The Intercollegiate Urdu Debate Competition 2026 was organised on the thought-provoking topic:

“KAMYABI KE LYE PAISA NAHI, KIRDAAR ZAROORI HAI”

The event aimed to promote critical thinking, eloquence, and ethical reflection among students.

The Chief Guest for the occasion was Ms. Ishrat Fatima -- a renowned Pakistani newsreader and broadcaster on Pakistan Television (PTV) and Radio Pakistan.

The contest was judged by an august panel of judges comprising Dr. Saira Bano (Chairperson, Dept. of Urdu, IIUI), Dr. Zeenat Afshan (Assistant Professor, Federal Urdu University) and Dr. Arshad Mahmood (Subject Specialist, IMCB G-7/2).

A total of eleven teams from various colleges, working under the ambit of FDE, presented their arguments both in favour of and against the motion. The speakers impressed the audience with their articulate expression, confidence, and depth of understanding, making the competition intellectually engaging and enriching.

Ujala Afzal from (IMCG (PG) F-7/2 Ibd.) won the first position in the competition which was withdrawn because she belonged to the host college in favour of Aliza (ICG F-6/2 Ibd.).

The **Intercollegiate Computer Graphics Competition 2026** was based on the Shakespearean phrase "Brave New World".
